- The Cattle originated from farms/ premises not quarantined for any bovine health reason at the time of certification,
- The cattle not within a withholding period or ESI for antibiotics
- The Animals for export were kept in a Bluetongue Virus free zone for a minimum of 60 days prior to transport to pre-export registered premises or since birth; **Yes (tick)**
- To the best of my knowledge, no diseases have been diagnosed on the property during the last five years that may make these cattle ineligible for export. I give permission for the relevant State Department of Agriculture to disclose herd disease information to a third party, ILE., in relation to the export of feeder/breeder/slaughter cattle;
- The cattle originated from farms/premises clinically free from anaplasmosis, babesiosis, theileria, cysticercosis, intestinal salmonella infections (salmonellosis), vibronic dysentery, bovine genital campylobacteriosis, trichomoniasis, surra, bluetongue and sporadic bovine encephalomyelitis for the last 12 months
- The property of origin has been clinically free from anthrax, bovine viral diarrhoea, malignant catarrhal fever, enzootic bovine leukosis, ephemerical fever, Q fever, haemorrhagic septicaemic, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis and leptospirosis for the last three years and paratuberculosis (Johnes disease) for previous 5 years,
- The cattle have not been fed mammalian protein
- No outbreak of the following contagious conditions have occurred on the property within the last thirty days: Actinomycosis (lumpy Jaw), Dermatophilosis (cutaneous streptothrichosis), Trichophytosis (ringworm), Contagious Ophthalmia / Bovine Keratoconjunctivitis (pinkeye). No cases of Hendra Virus has occurred during the last six months
- All cattle during the 30 days prior to shipment were free from clinical evidence of any disease
- The cattle to be exported are NLIS identified and registered on the NLIS database against the above PIC
- Livestock comply with all relevant state/territory health and welfare legislation and national codes of practice regarding on-property management and land transport according ASEL 3.0 (S1.1.1 – 1.1.9, S1.4.1 – 1.4.8, S2.1.1-2.1.3)
- Livestock will be loaded for road transport to the registered premises in accordance with ASEL 3.0 Standard 2 (S2.1.1-2.1.3)
- As part of the chain of responsibility all livestock are to be sourced and transported under the Australian Standards for the Export of Livestock Version 3.0 and to the advised ILE specifications. Please contact ILE, buyer or agent If you are unclear or require a copy of ASEL 3.0.

The original is then to be attached to NVD / Waybills and handed to transport driver for carriage to the pre-export registered premise.

It is the requirement of the Australian Livestock Export Standards (Version 3.0 November 2020) "when receiving and identifying livestock, the Depot Operator must obtain a copy of the Vendor Declaration/s regarding the property of source and health status of the livestock before accepting the livestock for the purpose of preparation for export". All livestock are to be sourced under standard 1 of the Australian Standards for the Export of Livestock Version 3.0 and to the advised International Livestock Export Pty Ltd specifications
